Glacier National Park of Canada Celebrates 125 Years of Railway Heritage in Rogers Pass – The Triumphs and the Tragedies



On August 15th, three hundred people gathered in Glacier National Park to join Parks Canada and Canadian Pacific as they celebrated the triumph of building the Canadian Pacific Railway 125 years ago over Rogers Pass, and remembered the centennial of Canada's largest avalanche accident that occurred on March 4th, 1910 at the summit of Rogers Pass – an accident that claimed the lives of fifty-eight railworkers, of whom thirty-two were Japanese.

Guests included Canadian Pacific, the Consulate General of Japan, local communities and family members who had lost relatives in the Rogers Pass avalanche one hundred years ago. Families travelled all the way from Japan and across Canada to honour their ancestors who died, and to visit the place where the avalanche had occurred.

As part of the event, Bill Fisher, Parks Canada Director General, Western and Northern Canada, with community volunteers Tomoko and Yuko Fujimura, opened the Rogers Pass Memory Garden Exhibit at the summit of Rogers Pass and rang the historic railway-engine bell. The sound of the bell

resonated through the mountains and everyone heard a sound not heard in Rogers Pass for 90 years. The exhibit acknowledges those who discovered, worked and died in Rogers Pass, and the importance of keeping the highway and railway safe for travellers today.



The event was a final tribute to the centennial of the Rogers Pass avalanche accident. Earlier in the year, on March 4th, more than eight-hundred people attended a candlelight memorial service in Revelstoke BC, to remember the fifty-eight lives lost.

Over the months leading up to the March 4th and August 15th events, countless school children and community groups across the country, and as far away as Japan, folded more than fifteen thousand origami cranes in memory of the lives lost a century ago.



According to Japanese custom, if you fold one thousand cranes your wish will come true. The cranes (Senbazuru) symbolized the wish to “never see such a tragedy again” and were displayed at both events.

In honour of the 125th anniversary of the day the railway tracks were laid across Rogers Pass en route to Craigellachie, BC, (location of the Last Spike), Canadian Pacific provided many guests with a memorable ride to Rogers Pass on the Empress 2816 steam train. For the event, guests travelled to the pass in the same manner that tourists and railworkers travelled more than one hundred years ago. The steam train and the Rogers Pass location provided an open window into the past for all to clearly imagine the triumphs and the tragedies of Rogers Pass’s rail heritage.

There will be AP Judging available at the TRAINS meet so please bring out your models to obtain a valuable modelling experience. Please contact me in advance if you have any questions about the required documentation or aspects of the AP.

I presented a clinic called 'Scratchbuilding 101' at the Lynnwood PNR convention and through the hard work of John Zuk, our 7th Division Webmaster, it is available for download on the 7th Div site: <http://pnr.nmra.org/7div/>. You must have MicroSoft PowerPoint installed on a PC or a MAC (or Apples 'Keynote') to be able to view it, although I'm told that if after you download it, you change the file extension to .pps you can view it on a PC without having the PowerPoint application installed. Please feel free to send me your comments about the clinic.

In the mean time, if you're not really sure what the AP is all about, check out <http://www.nmra.org/education/achievement/> or give me a call, I'd be happy to chat about it with you.

Lastly, a reminder that you don't have to wait for a meet to happen to be able to have your AP work judged or assessed, I can usually arrange to have that done between meets, please contact me.
